WHAT EPWORTH KIDS ARE EXPLORING IN APRIL



Elementary at 9:30: We are taking the month of April to talk about the life app Hope— Believing that something good can come out of something bad. As we help kids discover what biblical hope looks like, they'll be focusing on this month's memory verse "In this world you will have trouble. But be encouraged! I have won the battle over the world." John 16:33b, NIrV. We pray that Epworth's kids will learn to understand that while bad things sometimes happen, a life in Christ means that we can have eternal hope for that

light in the darkness.

Preschool & Toddler: God created us to be in a relationship with him and in relationships with people here on Earth. He wants us to have friends – and He wants to be a good friend. In fact He wants it so much, He sent his one and only son, Jesus, to show us how to be a good friend and to make a way for us to be friends with him forever. Because friends are such a big deal, we have packed this month with fun activities and engaging stories that we hope will help little ones learn that Jesus is their friend - the BEST friend they will ever have. This month's Bible Memory Verse: "In this world you



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
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
