Last year they were able to feed over 7,000 meals daily at 135 partner sites around Northwest Ohio. Every \$10 we raise helps provide 50 meals to kids in need. Money can be brought in and placed in the grocery bag in the Kid-to-Kid kiosk each Sunday through August 31.

## THE EPWORTH TOWER



Students may receive up to \$4,000 total during their schooling. Payments do not begin until seven months after graduation. If payments are made on time, there is no interest charged.
