- 1. Assemble a group of volunteers and decide upon the kind of good deed you would like to pursue. (Hint, you could clean a yard, paint a room, visit a senior living center, serve a meal, etc.)
- 2. Find the need in the community. - 3. Contact the person or agency and arrange the date, time and details of the project. Be sure the details are clearly understood between all parties, such as who is providing materials, supplies, tools etc. If space at Epworth is needed, be sure to clear it with the church office to reserve your space.
- 4. Communicate the details to your group so you can all show up as arranged. Take a group picture during the event if possible. Print it out (professional printing not required) or text it to 419.367.9549. If you wish, post on social media using #ServingThe419.
- 5. After completion of your project/good deed visit the S4:19 table in the lobby on any Sunday in October to register your good deed, post your picture and put a ping pong ball in the jar for every volunteer who participated. Let's see if we can fill the bottle!

FLU SHOT CLINIC

Epworth's annual flu shot clinic, with vaccines provided by the Lucas County Health Department, will be Sunday, October 6 from 8am - 12:30pm in the gym. All insurances are accepted and documentation will be filed for you. If you plan to self-pay, the cost is \$40. Please wear short-sleeved shirts to help expedite the administering of the vaccination. Allow plenty of time (about 30 minutes) if you plan to come before your worship service. Lucas County Health Department will be providing the regular quadrivalent vaccine, NOT the "high dose" vaccine for those over 65 as it will not be available yet.

KID-TO-KID: LEARN TO SERVE

We are taking donations of gently used or new toys for Hawkins STEMM Academy. Epworth volunteers help staff the Hawkins Hut, which provides awards for the Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports program. School children earn "Hawkeyes" for good behavior. Periodically these children can exchange "Hawkeyes" for toys at the Hut.
