NOVEMBER: DIABETES AWARENESS MONTH

Diabetes is a condition where your body does not respond normally to the hormone insulin, which allows your blood sugar to rise.

An estimated 84 million American adults, more than 1 in 3, have Prediabetes. Nearly 90% are unaware that they have it. Here are some signs of Prediabetes, from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention:

- Being overweight
- Being 45 years or older
- Having a parent, brother, or sister with type 2 diabetes
- Being physically active less than 3 times a week
- Ever having gestational diabetes (diabetes during pregnancy) or giving birth to a baby who weighed more than 9 pounds
- Having polycystic ovary syndrome

GROW: KIDS & YOUTH

HAWKINS STEMM ACADEMY PARTNERSHIP

Epworth volunteers stepped up to the challenge of preparing Hawkins students for an important reading test in September. In response to a request from principal Beth Stretavski, 18 tutors devoted 60-plus hours over a two-week



period working with 35 students. We were excited to learn from Ms. Stretavski that more than half of these student passed the test!

In the 2018-19 school year, Epworth volunteers logged more than 1,200 hours in a variety of activities:

- 25 tutors served an average of 51 students weekly, for a total of 512 tutoring hours; 5 kindergarten assistants each helped one day a week with a class of 23 students.
- 11 Book Initiative volunteers served a total of 115 students through the reader bag, book club, and kindergarten book day programs, for a total of 119 hours.
- 7 library volunteers served an average of 283 students every week, a total of 474 hours.
- 4 Garden Club volunteers worked with an average of 12 students monthly for a total of 33 hours.
- 19 volunteers helped with special events throughout the school year for a total of 117 hours. Nearly 600 students participated in these activities.

Planned Giving through the Legacy Endowment Fund is different from offerings and pledges. It focuses on the future, providing a gift from your estate or investments. Planned Giving to Epworth UMC helps to ensure the continuation of ministries, the development of programs, and the improvement of church facilities.

Types of Planned Gifts

- Bequests pass directly from your will or trust to the church. They can come in any form, from stocks to personal property to cash.
- Charitable Gift Annuities pay the donor a guaranteed income for life and make a contribution to the church.
- Life Insurance can be a convenient way to leave a gift by naming the church as a beneficiary of a policy.
- There are several other types of trusts and other arrangements that can be used to carry out the donor's wishes, such as Pooled Income Funds and Charitable Lead Trusts.

What should I do first?

Contact the church Business Office at 419.214.3770. Designate your gift for a specific purpose or you can choose to entrust your gift to the trustees which will use the gift where and when the need arises. Legacy Fund gifts of any size or design are appreciated and will be utilized carefully for the growth of Epworth and its ministries. The final decisions, however, are entirely up to you and your estate planning, legal, or financial advisor.

ATTENTION COOKIE BAKERS!


