ANNOUNCEMENT FROM THE SENIOR PASTOR



Grace and peace to you in the name of Christ Jesus, God's perfect light who shines brightly during this season of Epiphany. I write today to share with you that in November I communicated with Bishop Gregory Palmer, our District Superintendent Rev. Scot Ocke, our Staff Parish Relations Committee and our staff team my desire to make myself available for a new pastoral appointment in 2020. With my youngest son Clay graduating from high school this May and having

chosen to attend college out of state, along with accessing the second half of my pastoral ministry (22 years by God's grace thus far), now seems like the right moment to seek a new challenge either within the bounds of the West Ohio Conference or another area of the country.

Our District Superintendent met with the Staff Parish Relations Committee in late November and has received the congregational profile the committee constructed. The profile is a helpful tool used by our Bishop and his Cabinet as they soon begin the work of pairing available clergy and open congregations for 2020. Please pray for this important work. Ultimately, my change of appointment request lies in the hands of Bishop Palmer. There is a possibility he may decide it is best for us to remain in ministry together for another appointive year. I serve at the pleasure of the Bishop and trust his prayerful discernment.

In the meantime, we have much good work before us including a new Growth Plan adopted by our Administrative Council in December. The work of implementation begins as the Administrative Council meets in retreat later this month for the purpose of strategic planning. Such a plan designed, adopted, and the first steps of implantation undertaken will be helpful to your next Senior Pastor. She or he will be stepping unto a train in motion, moving towards greater growth and vitality. I am fully committed to a smooth transition during this season before us working closely with my successor to ensure a strong start for both your new Senior Pastor and this congregation, one that I have been so blessed to serve for these six years.


Did you know that there is a Social Group for parents?

EPWORTH KIDS EXPLORE: JANUARY




Elementary at 9:30:

HEALING SERVICES


