#### Ash Wednesday | February 26 | 12 noon & 7pm

Ash Wednesday has been a part of the Christian tradition for over ten centuries, and it marks the beginning of Lent, which is the six-week season of preparation for Easter. The service is marked by the imposition of ashes which signifies repentance (usually in the shape of the cross), which points us to the good news yet to come on Easter morning. Ash Wednesday is a powerful day in our faith as we are able to openly recognize our sinfulness, our frailty, and stare death in the face as we confess our need of a savior. We invite you to join us for one of our two services at 12 noon and 7pm, as we begin the Lenten season.

"For years I have felt called on to compose a choral work for Maundy Thursday. Each year, in the days leading up to Easter, I am reminded of the incredible, powerful story that is the selfless sacrifice of Jesus for all. I think of those who were there—the disciples, Mary, even Pilate and the passing stranger who carried the cross. I consider how they might have felt as they interacted with Jesus on his journey to the cross. Over the past 12 months, I have taken these reflections and finally created that work. A New Commandment is a 7-movement cantata for choir and orchestra that brings to life the perspectives of those characters in new ways, through monologue and song. It is my hope that through this music and drama, we might find ourselves in this story, in a more intimate way than before." - Kevin S. Foster

#### Good Friday, Stations of The Cross | April 10 | 12noon-4pm

On Good Friday, Epworth's sanctuary will once again host Stations of the Cross. It's an opportunity to reflect on Christ's sacrifice for us all and prepare for the Resurrection. Every year, artwork representing each station has been created by Epworth members and friends from the community. You can be a part of this too! I found Epworth exactly when I was supposed to. I believe I was led there by divine intervention and everything has happened exactly as it was supposed to...I was adopted at 6 days old and know nothing of my biological background. I was raised in a Conservative Jewish family. I went to Sunday School, was Bat Mitzvahed, went to services on the High Holy Days and celebrated the holidays with my family.

The only problem was- I was missing a spiritual connection to the religion and had only continued to practice as to not disappoint my mother. It was 2015 and Yom Kippur, the

holiest day in the Jewish Calendar. It was also the day the Pope came to the U.S. and I stayed home from services to watch him. It was then that I had an epiphany! I wanted to explore the Christian faith. I was giddy with excitement for my husband to come home so that I could share with him that I knew what was missing from my life and just like that, a true clarity came over me. I started reading and researching what it meant to be a Christian. I asked endless questions of my Christian friends what it meant to them to be a Christian. My husband was very supportive in my endeavor as he was raised in the Presbyterian Church. We started "shopping" churches and one of my closest friends guided me in my pursuit. Easter of 2016, I professed my belief in Jesus Christ at a church we were testing out. It was one of the most emotional experiences of my life. Tears of joy spilled from my eyes and my heart was overwhelmed with love as I acknowledged my belief in our Lord Savior.

It was shortly after that, that we decided to try out a service at Epworth. Epworth wasn't a stranger to us as our son was in Scouts and they were our sponsor, but we had never actually attended a service there. We were warmly greeted entering both the church and the doors to the sanctuary. Walking into the sanctuary I told my husband, "This feels right." We started attending regularly every Sunday thereafter. I had found my new spiritual home. My church family. My children and I were baptized, we became members and we have planted deep roots in our church. Our children attend Sunday School classes and S.W.A.T (Students With A Task) We volunteer for Serving 419, where we go out into the community and help others while spreading the love of Jesus Christ. I serve on the Children's Discipleship team and have come full circle as I am one of those faces that may greet you as you come into our welcoming church. I hope that you find it as inviting as I did and feel welcomed and supported by the Epworth community.

The love of Jesus is felt in every corner of our church. My faith continues to grow and flourish every day for I am blessed, truly blessed to have found my church family. They have embraced me and my family. Everyone is accepted for who they are, for God has made us this way. To know the teachings and love of Jesus have made my life complete. God gives us what we need, when we need it. I am no longer searching. Thanks Be to God!

**Preschool & Toddler:** All Aboard! This month your toddlers and preschoolers are learning that Jesus wants everyone to jump on board and be His friend forever. When we look at the kind of friend Jesus was while on Earth, we

see that he truly does love everyone. Think about people like the Samaritan woman at the well, Zacchaeus the tax collector, or the unloved woman dragged out into the streets by her accusers? When we look at how Jesus treated each of these people, we are left with a question about how we want our children to love others. Will they learn to love with accusations ready and rocks in hand –or- will we teach our children to love everyone NO MATTER WHAT just like Jesus did? So, let's get ready for an amazing ride together as your early childhood kiddos focus on this month's memory verse, "Love each other as I have loved you" (John 15:12), and learn to love just like Jesus loving everyone no matter what!

Elementary at 9:30: Love songs

are some of the best songs there are – love for our friends, family, our significant other, and love for our God. This time of year, playlists are filled with songs about love – so we are taking those playlists and turning them



around and talk about what the Bible says about Love. For this purpose, we will define the life app love as: Choosing to treat others the way you want to be treated. Because, after all, love IS a choice! We will look to the example of Jesus and see how he showed love while here on Earth. In fact, when the Pharisees asked Jesus which was the greatest commandment, he reached into the 600+ laws of the old testament to talk about love and connected things in a new way saying that loving ourselves, our God, and our neighbors was most important! We hope kids discover that they can love God with everything they've got. We pray that as your kids learn to love their God, love themselves, and love others, they get a glimpse of just how much God loves them and invites them to love others just as they are.

# FEBRUARY IS HEART MONTH!

Heart disease can happen at any age. High rates of obesity and high blood pressure among younger people (ages 35-64) are putting them at risk for heart disease earlier in life. Half of all Americans have at least one of the top three risk factors for heart disease (high blood pressure, high cholesterol, and smoking). Many of the conditions and behaviors that put people at risk for heart disease are appearing at younger ages:

- **High blood pressure**: Having uncontrolled high blood pressure is one of the biggest risks for heart disease and other harmful conditions, such as stroke.
- **High blood cholesterol:** High cholesterol can increase the risk for heart disease. Having diabetes and obesity, smoking, eating unhealthy foods, and not getting enough physical activity can all contribute to unhealthy cholesterol levels.
- **Smoking:** Smoking damages the blood vessels and can cause heart disease.
